WANTED - Volunteer Warden - Moorend Common

There is a need to appoint a new Volunteer Warden to act on behalf of Lane End Parish Council (LEPC) in respect of Moorend Common, which is an important designated Site of Special Scientific Interest. The current incumbent, Ross Osborn, is planning to retire from the role early in 2009 after several years' service. We are now into the second phase of “Re-Greening the Common” under the 10-year management plan. You may have seen the changes so far implemented, aimed at making a better wildlife habitat. The work is funded and directed by Natural England and carried out by contractors so the Warden is interfacing with this as well as monitoring the Common generally on behalf of the local Community.

A look back in time.....

FEBRUARY 1976 – CLARION V EDITION NO 1 – EDITORIAL

Clarion – a rousing call, loud & clear! But why five (V)? Because the Parish of Fingest & Lane End is not two places but five – Fingest, Cadmore End, Bolter End, Wheeler End and Lane End. That we share three of these with two other parishes merely adds sauce to the stew. What this magazine is setting out to do is to give them all news of each other and of portents and events outside which may affect the parish or a part of it.

Some of you may ask “Why Fingest & Lane End, rather than the other way around?” The answer lies in the past and the ancient parish of Fingest, which embraced Fingest, Cadmore End, Bolter End, Wheeler End and part of Lane End, the remainder of Lane End lying in the parishes of West Wycombe & Great Marlow. With a local government reorganisation in 1934, Lane End was joined to the parish of Fingest, but being the new boy, came second on the listing. Hence Fingest & Lane End – and not a bad thing either, reminding us that biggest is not necessarily best.

Which leads us to what will be a recurring theme of this magazine, and that is the need for us to guard our identity our rights and our wants. If we are weak, we shall surely become nothing more than a vassal of High Wycombe. But, if we want to survive, we must get together – and this is what this paper is all about: togetherness and its life blood, communications.

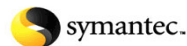

C O O K S

N 2oz ginger sliced
E ¼oz cloves
R 1oz mace
20 peppercorns
1oz nutmeg
3lb sugar
2qt cream

Method:

Mix all the ingredients in a large pot and heat slowly.

You can let it ‘settle’ for a few days and serve cool, depending on which way tastes better to you.

I then became a regular walker and contented myself being lead by experienced leaders, others who did the thinking, a change after a busy working life making decisions every day. I found, not only the physical exercise beneficial, but I believe even more important was the psychological boost that I received, being with such good company. After about a year of being on Auto Pilot (care of the leaders) I felt that I should contribute and decided to do the leaders course, this was efficiently run by Fiona Broadbent the local Simply Walk Coordinator, I subsequently received my certificate and then become a leader and back marker for the group.

I have enjoyed planning my walks in the Lane End area as there is such a variety of footpaths that one is never bored, and so far have returned all walkers back to the Recreation Ground Car park safe and sound.

This year I was drafted onto the committee of the Lane End Conservation Group as the Simply Walk Liaison member and have found the group very active in looking after the footpaths that we use on our walks, we have been able to contribute labour on the action days organized on the first Saturday in the month by the LECG. The Lane End Simply Walk Group is now the largest in the district and I would recommend all who need exercise and friendship to join us, you will find so much more than just the walking.

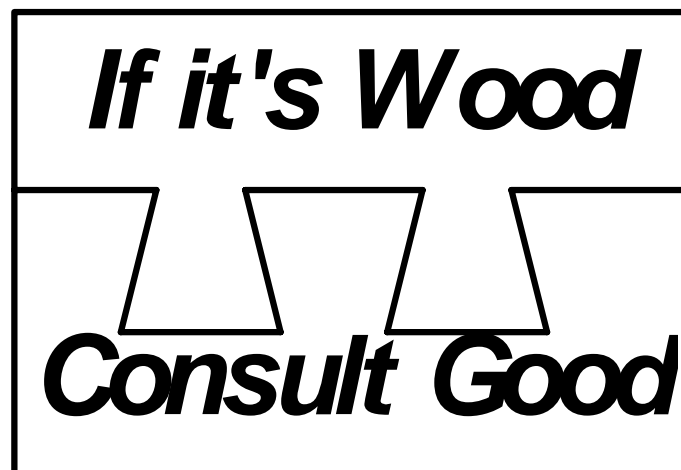

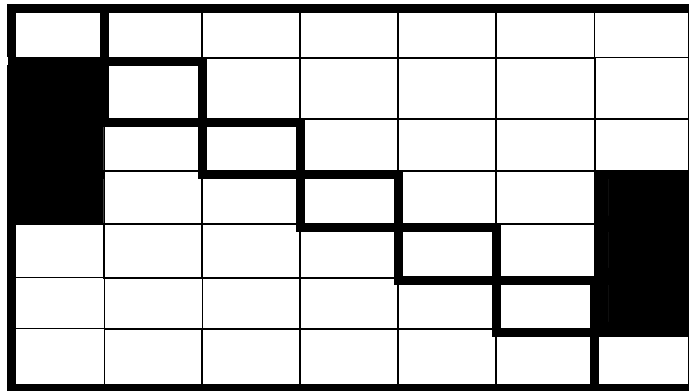

The re-greening of Moorend Common
Phase Two – Notice of Works from Lane End Parish Council

Natural England, will be taking place during January 2009, weather permitting. The overall project management will be the responsibility of Natural England.

Phase Two works, in line with the agreed Management Plan between LEPC and Natural England is intended to selectively thin mainly poor quality birch trees, in two areas, to encourage a diversity of plant and bird life and allow younger trees to mature. Intervention will be kept to a minimum though, inevitably, those areas worked on will initially look ‘raw’ before ‘re-greening’ starts. Trees of landscape or conservation value will be retained, wherever possible.

Additional, long overdue and necessary, works in connection with the, low voltage, overhead power cables and telephone lines will be phased for the same period.

North Meadow

The area between the two grass sections will be opened up to allow actual and visual reconnection with the smaller, more isolated section. The scrub and bracken area between the public footpath and the meadow will also be cleared to allow for the re-direction of the permissive bridleway from the gravel track down towards the Prince Albert pub. The existing bridleway will be closed and de-signed though the wooden bridge will not be removed.

Middle Meadow

The ‘western’ end of the existing meadow (the area between the overhead power cables and the Marlow Road) will be opened up to further increase the wood-pasture created by the thinning earlier this year. Some scrub clearance will also take place – the unfinished residue of the earlier works.

Scottish and Southern Electric will be carrying out essential works on the low-voltage cables in the area Woodpeckers to Folly Cottages while the BT Openreach telephone lines will also be cleared from overhanging trees – a task that is long overdue – in the same location.

Because of the expected volume of ‘lop and top’, on-site burning will be permitted under strict Natural England supervision.

Full details of the works will be posted around Moorend Common once plans have been finalised and a contractor chosen.

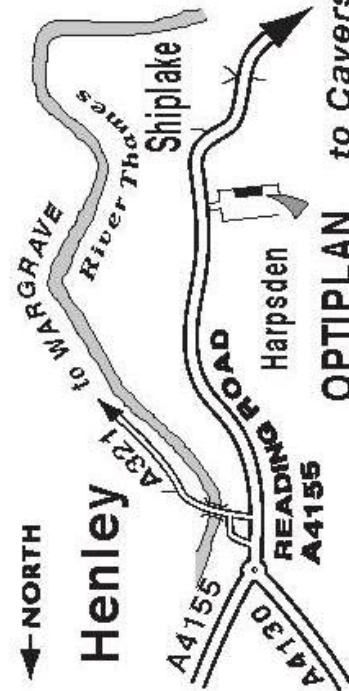

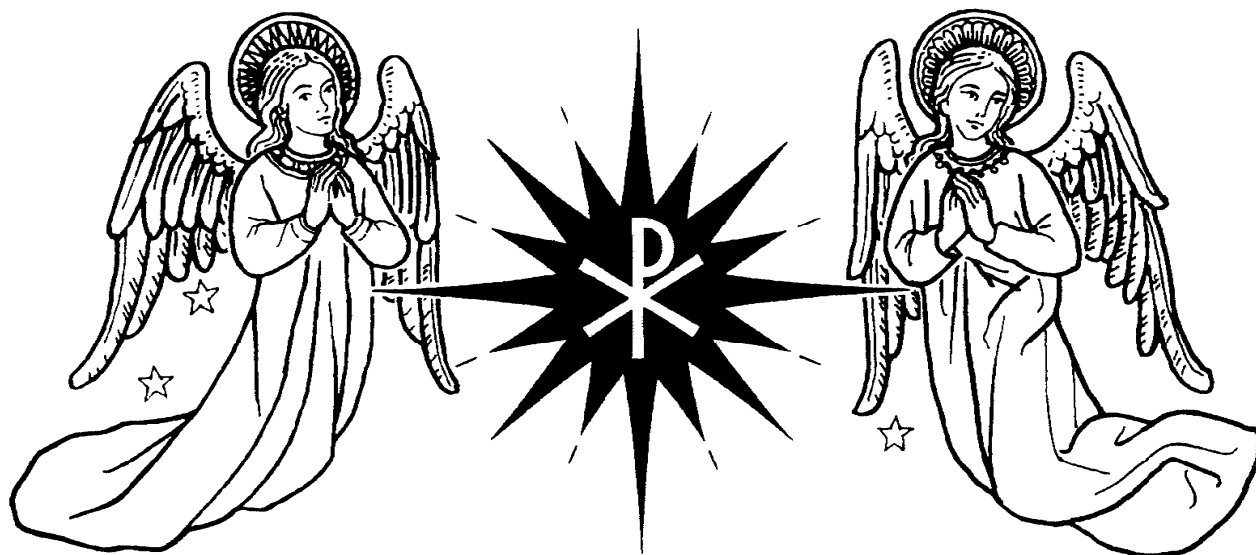

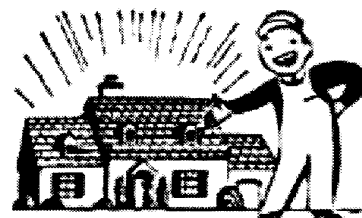

Better to Talk than to Vandalise

Recently one of the new kissing gates, which have replaced some of the stiles on footpaths in the parish, was vandalised. When the vandalised kissing gate was examined it became apparent that it had been installed incorrectly so that it would be difficult to use by, for example, a walker with a large dog. It is thus quite possible that the initial impetus for the vandalism arose from a difficulty in using the kissing gate. This does not excuse the vandalism of the gate. The problem could have been better dealt with if the obstructed walker had talked to someone concerned with the installation of these gates.

Within a week of the examination of the vandalised gate an order had been issued for its replacement and a short time later the gate was replaced by a self closing gate. The Lane End Conservation Group (LECG) has been guiding the program of stile replacements in the parish and has paid for 5 of the gates from LECG funds. It should however be clearly understood that LECG tries at all times to reflect the will of the inhabitants of Lane End. This can only happen if people will talk to us and tell us of desires and problems. It is not possible to promise that every desire and problem will be dealt with immediately but, for example, I can truthfully say that if the problem of the kissing gate had been brought to my attention, its replacement by a self closing gate would have been arranged. We have also taken up comments about how people use to rest on the steps of some of the stiles, particularly if there was nice view or the stile was in a sheltered sun trap. Negotiations with landowners are ongoing and it should be possible to install 3 or 4 simple seats in the spring.

Trim your heating bills

In July 2008, the UK's largest domestic energy supplier warned that gas bills could rise by up to 35% in 2008. This continues the upward trend in household gas and electricity costs since 2005.

Can we do anything to slow down these rising energy costs? As space and water heating account for around 60% of the energy used in the average home, this is a good place to start. Follow these 5 tips to trim your heating bills:

1. Use your programmer to switch the heating and hot water on and off and set your thermostat at between 18 and 21° C. Every 1° C above this increases your heating bill by 10%.
2. Avoid using the immersion heater to heat water. The relatively high unit cost of electricity makes it more cost effective to use your gas boiler for this.
3. Switch supplier or switch tariff. If you have Economy 7, time your washing machine and dish washer to exploit the cheaper night-time electricity tariff.
4. Make the most of each use of a given appliance. Wash clothes and dishes when you have a full load ready to go. Switch things off when not in use.
5. Insulate your home. Energy Saving Trust now estimates annual savings of £160 from installing cavity wall insulation. This is currently free to over 70s.

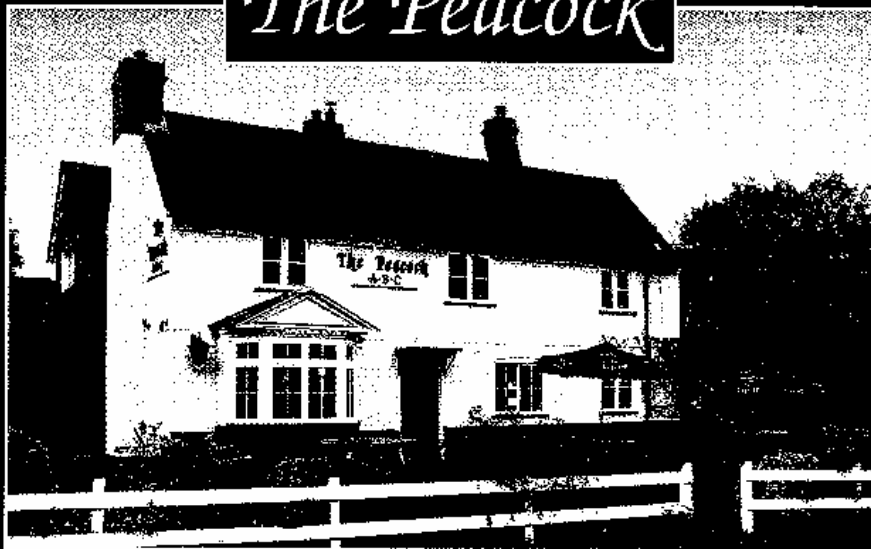
