

In our support groups, you can hear how other carers have coped and share your concerns if you wish. Our Local Foods and Farming

In the September issue of Clarion V we looked at global warming, the wet summer of 2007, flooding, world supplies of food and the price of bread and milk. What has happened in the last six months?

Firstly the good news, that last September and October were good months for weather with 81 mm (just over 3 inches) of rain in the two months, and with plenty of bright sunny days, and this resulted in ideal soil conditions on all the fields which were being planted with autumn sown wheat ready for harvest in August 2008.

Despite all the modern advances in the design of tractors, such as the size of the 4 wheel drive tractors which have been ploughing the fields near Lane End last September developing 275 horsepower from their 8.1 litre engines, and their sat-nav monitors in the cab to measure the size of the field and to steer the tractor along a line precisely parallel to the previous bout across the field and the right distance away from it, good weather and soil conditions are still the most important factors to make a good seed-bed. And a good seed-bed is just as important on the farm as in the vegetable garden to start a healthy and high yielding crop. So the news on the arable farms, where the milling wheat for bread making is grown, is good news with the crops looking well.

But the livestock farms continue to have difficulties, both with their production costs increasing more than the farmgate price of the food which they produce, and with disease adversely affecting the health of their animals. There is a disease new to Britain called 'Blue Tongue' which is likely to become very serious amongst cattle and sheep when the warmer weather comes. This disease is spread by infected midges which bite the cattle and sheep to suck their blood, but in so doing they infect them with the blue tongue disease. This disease used to be only seen in Africa where the hot climate suited the midges, but last year it spread to Belgium where 90% of the cattle became infected and 11% to 15% of them actually died. Then on 5th August 2007, when the wind blew from Belgium across the Channel taking the midges with it, the cattle and sheep in Norfolk became infected. The English Institute for Animal Health have developed an inactivated vaccine to protect the cattle and sheep, and they hope that 22 million doses of it will be available by May 2008. But they do not know if this will be sufficient or if it will be soon enough.

This recipe is a twist on the Classic Macaroni Cheese, & goes well with a crisp green salad.

Serves Four

COOKS

0 R N E R

Ingredients:

225 grams short cut macaroni.
oil
salt 25 grams butter
1 x 15 ml spoon plain flour
300 ml milk
4 hard boiled eggs, chopped
freshly ground black pepper
1 large onion, peeled
& sliced

75 grams grated cheese

Macaroni Eggs Lyonnaise

Method:

Prep & cooking time approx 30 minutes Oven 200°C 400°F Gas Mark 6

Put the macaroni in a large pan of boiling water with 1 x 15 ml spoon of oil a 1 x 5 ml spoon of salt cook until al dente.

Meanwhile makes the sauce by melting the butter in a pan, stir in the flour and cook for about 30 seconds. Remove from heat & slowly stir in the milk, return to a gentle heat until thickened. Stir in the chopped eggs and season with salt & pepper to taste. Add the drained macaroni to the sauce. Place in a lightly oiled ovenproof dish. Fry the sliced onion in a little oil until it starts to brown, spoon over the macaroni mix and sprinkle with the cheese. Bake in a preheated over for 15-20 minutes.

Lane End Conservation Group

At the beginning of December nine members of the Lane End Conservation Group gave up one Saturday morning to work on the hedge between the main car park and Botany Brook, first extracting weeds and litter and then pruning the recently planted shrubs on the bank of the brook. At least twice a year this area needs attention.

A local resident had contacted us to ask if we could please clear the footpath off Slayter Road again, where encroaching brambles had almost swallowed up the path, making it difficult for residents to use. Eight of our helpers turned up and set to work. After we finished we received a couple of telephone calls to thank LECG's volunteers.

Another request came from Christine Jennings. She pointed out that unchecked vegetation on the green patch by Black Well was obstructing the view of the road and thus oncoming traffic. We had planned to work on the area surrounding Foundry Pond, winter pruning and litter picking, but our eight helpers instead gave priority to cutting back brambles and other plants thus ensuring the pavement was clear before they got on with other tasks.

Many Lane End residents use Four-Fields footpath (LE 33) and report to us on the state of it. With a length of about ¾ mile this path will be cleared by our helpers on the first Saturday in March. We also plan to work in the Harris Garden, spring pruning, litter picking and possibly planting some spring flowers; it always depends on how many helpers turn up.



Following a request from the Simply Walk group, whose walkers (around 50 each week) meet at the Lane End playing fields car park, volunteers of the Lane End Conservation Group and the local Simply Walk group will spend the first Saturday morning in April working on this car park. In May and June last year we pruned the originally planted shrubs along the edge of it and cut back rampant vegetation; we cleared litter, swept up glass and removed fire damaged rubbish. We had hoped to clear all weeds from the

Boules/Petanque square as well, so as to make it useable again, but there were not enough volunteer hours available.

The church is alive but the building is old and it requires a lot of expensive repair and alteration to comply with necessary access and Health and Safety regulations. Caring for the building has hindered us in effectively caring for the community.

The people who have worshipped in the chapel are the church – not the building – so we have decided to sell the building and embark on a new adventure.

Due to the generosity of our fellow Christians at the Parish Church we have been offered the use of their premises for our Sunday Worship, unconditionally for a year, while the Methodist Church Council, with the assistance of the High Wycombe Circuit, look for an alternative venue for the future.

We have been overwhelmed by the hands of friendship extended to us by the Rev Robert Jennings and the members of the PCC and Holy Trinity congregation, who have helped us with our decisions. We would like to express our heartfelt thanks and gratitude and look forward to our association with them all. Jesus often spoke of the importance of unity amongst His followers because he knew how important it was for people to unite to show the face of God to the world. We believe that together we can do this in Lane End. Many other people and organisations in the Village have been very helpful and have helped us find alternative venues for our Outreach activities. We would like to thank them all, in particular the Village Hall committee who have been extremely accommodating.

Methodism is alive and well in Lane End and we will celebrate this on the 30th March 2008 at 3pm with a Service of thanksgiving and celebration for everything that the Chapel building has helped us achieve (followed by a tea in the Village Hall to which everyone is invited.)

On Sunday the 6th April at 11am and again at 6pm we will begin our worship services in Holy Trinity Church – all are welcome. We encourage you all to meet us in Holy Trinity at 10.30 am for coffee with our Parish Church friends before the service.

Lane End Parish Council-Activities Update

- ** As mentioned in our last report in Clarion V your Council was nearly up to full strength following the co-option of Councillors Callum Stewart and Graham Coulter. We can now report our final vacancy has been filled following the very recent co-option of Councillor Graham Davis
- ** We have now undertaken our analysis of the completed questionnaires we received asking your views on virtually every aspect of life in the parish; you may recall that we received a response rate of nearly 40%.

We have initially decided to divide the work into 5 project areas:

Environment
Transport
Communications
Business
Community Issues

In the coming weeks we will agree priorities within each sector and attempt to set up teams comprising Councillors and residents in order to achieve short and long term objectives.

The Council needs the active support of residents to make the improvements you have shown you want made.

** By the time you read this work will have been completed on Phase One of our long term plan to ensure Moor End Common retains its SSSI status and makes it even more accessible as a leisure facility.

We will have obtained professional advice on the erection bollards in the first lay-by in Church Road to prevent further erosion from vehicles, and have installed a Forestry gate further along Church Road to facilitate access for contractors.

**Many of you have noticed and indeed remarked on the fact that The Council's notice boards being vandalised. This thoughtless and stupid behaviour by a very small minority is not only a cause of annoyance to residents but of course impacts adversely on our finances.

The most recent vandalism has cost over £2000 which represents a significant percentage of our budget....WHAT A WASTE OF MONEY!!

If you know who these individuals are, who are causing this and other damage please do let our Clerk, Mandy Dunning know....in strictest confidence.

** We hope you've noticed the increased level of policing in and around the village. This very welcome development is due in no small part to the work of The Community Safety Forum lead by Councillor Atkins.

News from Buckinghamshire County Council

POTHOLES

The Bane of the Travelling Public!

The majority of potholes are picked up by highway staff carrying out statutory safety inspections. These inspections are carried out in accordance with a National Code of Practice which lays down the frequencies for the various classes of road, these are:

Strategic Routes, Main Distributors (A&B roads) & Town Centres - twelve times per year

Local Interconnecting Roads (C roads) – four times per year

Local Access Roads (Unclassified roads) – twice per year

The Council also rely on information from Members of Public who can report a pothole by calling **Highways on Call on 0845 230 2882 or by email to <u>hoc@buckscc.gov.uk</u>

Types of Defect: There are three types of potholes:**

Category 1 – These are potholes that could represent imminent danger to the road user, these will be dealt with within 24 hours of being notified. The criteria for such potholes is that they must be greater than 40mm deep AND extending greater than 300mm in any direction.



Category 2.1 – These are potholes that do not currently meet the criteria for category 1 but it is considered that they will have deteriorated sufficiently to become hazardous before the next scheduled inspection is carried out on that road. Wherever possible, these will be dealt with within 28 days.



Category 2.2 – These are areas that are showing early signs of defects forming and are dealt with as part of the planned routine maintenance programme of works over a greater period of time.



Remedial Actions:

There are three types of remedial actions for dealing with potholes;

Permanent Action – this involves cutting the sides of the pothole square, removing all loose material, applying a tack coat (to act as a bonding agent between the existing road and the new material), then filling the hole with hot material – usually hot rolled asphalt from the quarry, this is then compacted and the edges sealed. This action is carried out on the first visit to all category 2.1 potholes and as many of the category 1 potholes as possible.

Temporary Action –This is only used for category 1 potholes where weather conditions or resources make it too difficult to carry out a permanent repair. This involves sweeping the loose material and any water out of the hole and filling with a temporary emergency patching material. A permanent repair would then be ordered to be carried out within 28 days. The council is currently experimenting with new proprietary materials that will give a semi-permanent first time fix. It is still early in the trials, but the initial results are very encouraging.

Immediate Action – Again this is used only for Category 1 potholes and only in those instances where it is not possible to carry out a more substantial repair e.g. if there is lots of running water. It is likely to take the form of signing and guarding of the area around the pothole.

A potholing gang can carry out between 20 and 30 permanent repairs per day. The controlling factors are the location of the potholes which will determine the amount of traffic control required and also how widespread they are which determines how much travelling time is required between sites.

M 40 CEG (Chiltern Environmental Group) Jan 2008

Our Group represents villages and smaller communities along the 'old' section of the M 40, which evolved from the Wycombe Bypass and its extension to Wheatley. We have been working for the past 3 years to reduce the impact of traffic on the lives of 25,000 people who live close to the route between Junction 3 at Loudwater and Junction 7 at Milton Common. Noise levels in particular are already extremely high, night and day, week days and weekends – and will get worse until the issue is resolved.

The M40 is now recognised as one of the highest accident prone stretches of Motorway in the UK. We are backing the Bucks Free Press to address this. The obvious and cheapest solution, to limit the traffic speed on this section, would also significantly reduce noise and pollution – and a reduction in the amount of closures of the motorway due to accidents, would lower the temptation for drivers to use our minor roads in preference to the Motorway.

Throughout our campaign we have enjoyed the support of our 4 local MP's – Dominic Grieve (Beaconsfield), Paul Goodman (Wycombe), David Liddington (Aylesbury), and Boris Johnson (Henley). As a result, our problems have been debated in the House of Commons and we plan to meet with the responsible Minister shortly. Our campaign is supported by Wycombe and South Oxfordshire District Councils and by our County Councils, and is funded by contributions from the councils of all affected Parishes.

We endeavour to keep residents updated on our progress at occasional open meetings, through the local press and by email. 


