1) Public Questions

A Parishioner gave an update re the Finings Wood Community Group and their aspirations. The Finings Wood Community Group are collaborating with The Friends of Theatre on the Row group and hope to provide an active children's adventure programme. The Finings Wood Community group have over 300 members and are embarking on a funding exercise. However, it is thought that the funding expectations will fall short of the monies needed. The group currently has pledges of approx. £20,000. It was also reported that Finings Wood will soon to be registered on the ancient tree index created by the Woodland Trust. It was also commented that woodlotting is a concern. The group requested a meeting with LEPC Spending Priorities Group. The SPG agreed to meet the Friends of Finings Wood Group, this would be arranged via The Clerk.

- 4. Agreed a quotation with Enerveo for new LED lanterns on street lighting columns 54 & 55 Forgets Road, £757.92 + VAT.
- 5. Agreed a quotation with Enerveo for new a LED lantern on street lighting column 99 Johnson Road, 378.96 + VAT.
- 6. CIL Report completed and returned to Buckinghamshire Council. Also uploaded to the website.
- 7. Arranged for the hedge at Bunkers Allotments to be cut back.
- 8. The approved Environmental Policy has been updated to the website.
- 9. The Social Media Policy has been uploaded to the website.
- 10. The local police team will carry out random speed checks.
- 11. A number of Parishioners are concerned about the lower pond.
- 12. Red Kite Community Housing arranged for the foliage on footpath 25 to be cut back.
- 13. A contractor will be spraying the knotweed in several areas in the parish.
- 14. I have ordered a poppy wreath for Remembrance Sunday.
- 15. Christmas in the Village will be held at Lane End Village Hall on Friday 9th December 2022
- 16. The fence at Chalky Field allotments is rotting in several places and there are several holes in the chicken wire. I have asked for a quotation for the repairs.
- 17. There is a tree on Moorend Common, overhanging the oil tank. I have requested a quotation for the works.

- Contacted the police regarding repeated attempts to set fire to several items in the woods off of Simmons Way.
- 19. Signed and returned the Devolved Services agreement for this year.
- 20. There was a faulty tap and toilet at the Lane End Sports Pavilion, these have been repaired.
- 21. There are mole holes at Lane End Playing Fields. A contractor is undertaking works re this.
- 22. I have organised for KND Surveys to carry out assessments at Ditchfield Common and Lane End Playing Fields as per Cllr Stewart.
- 23. Agreed quotation 76 Hobbs Road To remove 1 no. existing lighting column and to supply and install 1 no. 5m R2505T01 galvanised lighting column in the original position with Micro Highway Diamond Elite lantern post top mounted at 0 degrees to horizontal with 16 neutral white (4000k) LEDs, 400mA CLO driver (19w), S0 optic and Zodion SS6 35 lux all night photocell control. To supply and fit isolator with 6A fuse and equipotential earthing including earth terminal block and number the lighting column. The lantern will be factory finished in grey. To also carry out electrical inspection and testing with certification. £1,033.57.
- 24. Agreed Quotation 76 Hobbs Road To transfer 1 no. single phase unmetered service within 3 metres (carried out in a single visit). £688.31.
- 25. I have checked the AED units.

6) Matters arising from previous meeting

It was reported that Cllr Graham would like to organise a working group meeting to discuss how the Council can be more user friendly. The Chairman and Cllr Graham will have a meeting and formulate a draft policy. This will be presented to Council at a future meeting.

7) Finance -

7.1 Approval of the account for July 2022 Council unanimously approved the accounts.

7.2 Approval of the account for August 2022 Council unanimously approved the accounts.

7.3 Expenditure against Budget report Council noted the budget report.

7.4 Donation Request – Friends of Finings Wood

The Friends of Finings Wood Group asked LEPC to consider allocating some funds for professional fees that will be incurred in establishing the body as a legal and Charitable entity.

The Parish Council approved a S137 donation request of up to £1000.

The donation was approved on the understanding that there is no implication on The Parish Council regarding any further contribution towards the purchase of Finings Wood.

The Friends of Finings Wood Group will liaise with Cllr Nicolson regarding structure. The Clerk will be informed of the outcome.

7.5 To consider the request for a replacement water urn – LEYCC

LEYCC has requested LEPC replace the water urn which is no longer fit for purpose. The cost for this is £409.00 plus VAT.

LEPC approved the replacement of the water urn as it is a fitting in the building.

It was noted that LEYCC currently have a good level of reserves.

It was also noted that there is an issue with damp at LEYCC and LEPC will need to investigate their responsibilities if monies are requested.

7.6 To consider the Parish Council Insurance Policy

The insurance policy is due for renewal shortly and we have received a renewal quote from Hiscox Insurance Company Limited for the period from the 1st October 2022 to the 30th September 2023.

The premium quoted (including IPT and all fees) for the year will be: £5,673.39.

The insurance company recommends we enter a Long-Term Agreement, the same quote as above for a 3 year period.

Council approved the insurance renewal quotation based on the long term agreement over a 3 year period.

It was also suggested that LEPC instructs a company that specialises in valuations for sports clubs. Construction costs have gone up by an estimated 20%. Therefore, it would be prudent to request the valuation of the property to ensure that the correct insurance value is in place.

The Clerk will also ask for the wording 'Children's Play Equipment' to be replaced with the '3G multi sports games area'.

8) Policies / Regulations -

8.1 Complaints Policy (amended)

Council approved the following amendment 2.12 – "The outcome of the complaint will be announced at the Full Parish Council Meeting."

8.2 Unreasonably Persistent or Vexatious Complaints Policy

Council approved the unreasonably persistent or vexatious complaints policy with the additional caveat of an appeals procedure via one of our three ward Buckinghamshire Councillors.

The Clerk will discuss this with Cllr Dominic Barnes and add the additional caveat to the policy.

9) Allotments -

9.1 To consider revised tenancy agreement

Council approved the amended tenancy agreement. The Clerk will issue the new tenancy agreement with the rental invoices.

9.2 To consider allotment rents

Council agreed to hold the allotment rents for 22/23 as follows:

Small Plots £21.00 / Large Plots £40.00.

Tenants in receipt of their pension receive a 50% discount. Rents are invoiced annually.

9.3 To consider the quotation for hedge works at Chalky Field Allotment

The Clerk had received a quotation for the reduction of the boundary hedge height by 2 meters.

However, Nicolas King Homes have suggested that the hedge provides a degree of screening and given that the planning application is currently live the PC should refrain from carrying out any works to the boundary hedge at this moment.

The Parish Council agreed to defer this discussion until the planning application has been determined.

9.4 To consider quotation for replacement fence posts and chicken wire

The estimate to remove and replace approximately 20 posts, all to be concreted, To patch the chicken wire where necessary and replace rails where necessary – Estimate £1700.00 including materials and labour. Council approved the quotation.

10) Matters raised by Councillors

Cllr Nicolson and Cllr Detsiny met with Hey Broadband re the existing broadband project. Progress has been slower than expected.
