- 2.1 BMKALC National Association of Local Councils (NALC) is urging the government to give parish and town councils a more significant role in the protection of hedgerows. NALC argue that the current Hedgerow Regulations 1997 should be simplified to make them easier to understand, more widely applied and give communities represented by local councils a more significant say in hedgerow protection in their areas.
- NALC states that local councils should be consulted before hedgerows are removed and that the government should prioritise hedgerow protection like trees as hedgerows have a crucial role in the ecosystem of water and carbon absorption. More detail can be found on the NALC website.
